Module I: Introduction to Postural Rehabilitation

The “Introduction to Postural Rehabilitation” is a required module for the continuing courses in both canine and equine PR, and the courses have to be followed in a numbered order. In order to participate in Canine module II, you must have completed the Introduction course, and you can continue directly from the Introduction course to the Canine module II in this seminar. Former students may “audit” for a reduced cost, for further information please contact Eickemeyer. In order to participate in Equine module IV, you must have completed the Introduction course, Equine module II and III. Equine module II and III will not be offered in this series of courses.

Program:

Module I "Introduction to Postural Rehabilitation"

This 3 day introductory seminar is for both equine and small animal practitioners, and we will work with both dogs and horses. It has a high proportion of scientific content, to give a solid background in the biological basis of the clinical techniques. We will focus on the structure and function of the upper cervical region and the related biomechanics of locomotion. Individual and group instructions on correct practitioner body mechanics and function are an essential part of this module. There will be Alexander Technique workshops. To maximize practical and experiential programming on site, some of the conceptual programming is on a distance learning format, in June or July, where all participants will attend 1 day of **webinar lectures**. These lectures will be video-recorded, and can be showed any time until October 2019. Further information will be given after registration.

Canine module II "Canine Postural Rehabilitation"


In this seminar small animal practitioners learn about the contributions of the stomatognathic system and distal extremities to posture. We will work with canine bite and skull malformations, and will explore the structure and function of the distal extremities. Focus will be on effective handling techniques and will provide significant improvement in clinical skills for diagnostics and treatment. Each participant has an individually tailored tutorial session to learn the basic postural reprogramming techniques. Positive coaching interaction and hands on practice provide opportunities for each participant to develop the skills taught, and integrate case management concepts. There will be Alexander Technique workshops. Practical sessions include both adult dogs and puppies. To maximize practical and experiential programming on site, some of the conceptual programming is on a distance learning format, in June or July, where all participants will attend 1 day of **webinar lectures**. These lectures will be video-recorded, and can be showed any time until October 2019. Further information will be given after registration.

Equine module IV "Equine Advanced Postural Rehabilitation Techniques"

In this 3 day seminar, each participant has an individually tailored tutorial session to refine their basic postural reprogramming techniques, and learn new ones for the hind end of the horse. Positive coaching interaction and hands on practice provide opportunities for each participant to develop the skills taught, and integrate case management concepts. Private Alexander Technique lessons will be given. To maximize practical and experiential programming on site, some of the conceptual programming is on a distance learning format, in June or July, where all participants will attend approximately ½ day of **webinar lectures**. These lectures will be video-recorded, and can be showed any time until October 2019. Further information will be given after registration.

Elizabeth Reese, AmSAT, M.Ed, LMHC, is a certified Teacher of the Alexander Technique, a certified dressage instructor, and a licensed mental health counselor. She began studying the AT in 1981 with Marjorie Barstow and considered the work as a core part of her training as a dancer/choreographer/performer in NYC. She certified as an AT teacher in 1994. She was a senior faculty member at AT-NYC for ten years and is a co-founder/instructor at Postural Rehabilitation, a continuing education program for veterinarians using alternative care in treatment. Her interest in the embodied experience of trauma led her to her masters work in mental health counseling and, in 2014, her work as a research associate on a study exploring the significance of posture in performance, injury, relationship and emotional regulation, using horses as models, funded by the American Holistic Veterinary Foundation. Her Alexander workshops have been presented around the country. Elizabeth is currently on faculty at Bard College *Graduate Vocal Arts Program* and at *Neighborhood Playhouse* in NYC.
